"Drama Therapists and Dance/Movement Therapists Licensing Act."

## CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

AN ACT providing for the licensure of <sup>1</sup>[drama therapists and 1 dance/movement] creative arts<sup>1</sup> therapists, and supplementing 2 Title 45 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the 5 6 State of New Jersey: 7 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "<sup>1</sup>[Drama 8 Therapists and Dance/Movement Therapists ] Creative Arts Therapies<sup>1</sup> 9 Licensing Act." 10 11 12 2. The <sup>1</sup>[professions of drama therapy and dance/movement therapy] <u>creative arts therapy professions</u><sup>1</sup> in the State of New Jersey 13 are determined to affect the public safety and welfare, and to be 14 15 subject to regulation and control in the public interest in order to protect the public by setting standards of qualification, education, 16 training, and experience for <sup>1</sup>[clinical drama therapists, clinical 17 dance/movement therapists, associate drama therapists, and associate 18 19 dance/movement] professional creative arts therapists and associate creative arts<sup>1</sup> therapists. 20 21 22 3. As used in this act: "Board" means the State Board of <sup>1</sup> Marriage and Family Therapy 23 Examiners] Creative Arts Therapists.<sup>1</sup> 24 "Board Certified Dance/Movement Therapist" means a person who 25 26 practices dance movement therapy and is certified by the 27 Dance/Movement Therapy Certification Board. 28 <sup>1</sup>["Committee" means the Drama Therapy and Dance/Movement 29 Therapy Advisory Committee established pursuant to section 4 of this 30 act. "Creative arts therapist" means any person licensed to practice a 31 32 creative arts therapy pursuant to the provisions of this act. 33 "Creative arts therapy" means the integrated use of psychotherapeutic principles with art media, the creative process, 34 creative expression, or creative movement to assist individuals, 35 36 families or groups in: 37 (1) increasing awareness of self and others; 38 (2) coping with symptoms, stress, and traumatic experiences; 39 (3) enhancing cognitive abilities; 40 (4) identifying and assessing clients' needs in order to implement 41 therapeutic intervention to meet developmental, behavioral, mental, 42 and emotional needs; and

2 "Dance/movement therapist" means any person licensed to
3 practice dance/movement therapy pursuant to the provisions of this
4 act.

5 "Dance/movement therapy" means the integrated use of 6 dance/movement and psychotherapeutic principles in a creative process which furthers the emotional, physical, cognitive, and social 7 8 integration of the individual by utilizing, as a behavioral health 9 discipline, the application of fundamental mental health, 10 psychological, developmental and mind/body principles in order to: 11 (1) facilitate human development and adjustment throughout the 12 lifespan; (2) identify and assess clients with mental, emotional, or behavioral disorders that interfere with mental health or adequate 13 14 functioning in order to implement therapeutic intervention to meet 15 developmental, behavioral, mental and emotional needs; (3) conduct 16 assessment for the purposes of evaluation and establishing treatment 17 goals and objectives; and (4) plan, implement and evaluate treatment 18 interventions designed to meet developmental, behavioral, mental and 19 emotional needs for individuals or groups.

20 "Drama therapist" means any person licensed to practice drama21 therapy pursuant to the provisions of this act.

22 "Drama therapy" means the integrated use of psychotherapeutic 23 principles, theater and creative processes to further the emotional, 24 physical, cognitive, and social well-being of the individual. As a 25 behavioral health discipline, the application of fundamental mental 26 health, psychological, developmental, and mind/body principles are 27 synthesized in an experiential process in order to: (1) facilitate human 28 development and adjustment throughout the lifespan; (2) identify and 29 assess clients with mental, emotional or behavioral disorders that 30 interfere with mental health or adequate functioning in order to 31 implement therapeutic intervention to meet developmental, behavioral, 32 mental and emotional needs; (3) conduct assessment for the purposes 33 of evaluation and establishing treatment goals and objectives; and (4) 34 plan, implement and evaluate treatment interventions designed to meet 35 developmental, behavioral, mental, and emotional needs for 36 individuals or groups.

37 "Drama Therapy Board Certified Trainer" means a person who has
38 been practicing drama therapy for a minimum of five years and is
39 certified by the North American Drama Therapy Association.

41 a current, valid license issued pursuant to section 11 of P.L.2015,
42 c.199 (C.45:8B-61).<sup>1</sup>

43 "Licensed associate dance/movement therapist" means an
44 individual who holds a current, valid license issued pursuant to section
45 13 of this act.

46 "Licensed associate drama therapist" means an individual who47 holds a current, valid license issued pursuant to section 12 of this act.

"Licensed clinical dance/movement therapist" means an individual
 who holds a current, valid license issued pursuant to section 11 of this
 act.

4 "Licensed clinical drama therapist" means an individual who holds
5 a current, valid license issued pursuant to section 10 of this act.

<sup>1</sup>"Licensed professional art therapist" means an individual who
holds a current, valid license issued pursuant to section 10 of
P.L.2015, c.199 (C.45:8B-60).<sup>1</sup>

9 "Registered Dance/Movement Therapist" (R-DMT) means a
10 person who practices dance/movement therapy and is registered by the
11 Dance/Movement Therapy Certification Board.

12 "Registered Drama Therapist" means a person who practices
13 drama therapy and is registered by the North American Drama
14 Therapy Association.

15 "Supervision" means: (1) ensuring that the extent, kind, and quality of <sup>1</sup>[drama therapy or dance/movement] creative arts<sup>1</sup> therapy 16 performed, as the case may be, is consistent with the education, 17 training, and experience of the person being supervised; (2) reviewing 18 19 client or patient records, monitoring and evaluating assessment, and treatment decisions of <sup>1</sup>[the drama therapy or dance/movement]  $\underline{a}$ 20 creative arts<sup>1</sup> therapy supervisee; (3) monitoring and evaluating the 21 ability of the licensed associate <sup>1</sup> [drama therapist or licensed associate 22 dance/movement therapist] in a creative arts therapy<sup>1</sup> to provide 23 services to the particular clientele at the site or sites where he will be 24 25 practicing; (4) ensuring compliance with laws and regulations governing the practice of  ${}^{1}$  [the]  $\underline{a}^{1}$  licensed  ${}^{1}$  [clinical drama therapist 26 27 or licensed clinical dance/movement therapist;] professional in a creative arts therapy; and<sup>1</sup> (5) completing that amount of direct 28 observation, or review of audio or videotapes of <sup>1</sup>[drama therapy or 29 dance/movement] <u>a creative arts<sup>1</sup></u> therapy, as deemed appropriate by 30 the <sup>1</sup>[supervisor; and (6) completing the services conducted by a 31 32 Drama Therapy Board Certified Trainer or by a Registered Drama 33 Therapist with a minimum of five years of full-time professional 34 experience, or a Board Certified Dance/Movement Therapist. ] board.<sup>1</sup>

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4. There is created within the Division of Consumer Affairs in the 36 Department of Law and Public Safety, <sup>1</sup>[under the State Board of 37 38 Marriage and Family Therapy Examiners, a Drama Therapy and 39 Dance/Movement Therapy Advisory Committee] the State Board of <u>Creative Arts Therapies</u><sup>1</sup>. The <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> shall consist of 40 <sup>1</sup>[six] eleven<sup>1</sup> members who are residents of the State <sup>1</sup>[as follows: 41 42 three members who are clinical drama therapists and three members who are clinical dance/movement therapists]<sup>1</sup>. Except for the 43 members first appointed: <sup>1</sup>[three] <u>eight</u><sup>1</sup> of the members shall be 44 <sup>1</sup>[licensed clinical drama therapists] therapists who are licensed in 45 46 creative arts therapies, including but not limited to art therapy,

dance/movement therapy, drama therapy, and music therapy<sup>1</sup> under 1 the provisions of this act and shall have been actively engaged in the 2 practice of  ${}^{1}$  [drama] <u>a creative arts</u>  ${}^{1}$  therapy for at least five years 3 immediately preceding their appointment<sup>1</sup>[; and three of the members 4 shall be licensed clinical dance/movement therapists under the 5 6 provisions of this act and shall have been actively engaged in the 7 practice of dance/movement therapy for at least five years immediately preceding their appointment.] . The remaining members shall be 8 public members.<sup>1</sup> 9

10 The Governor shall appoint the members with the advice and 11 consent of the Senate. Each member shall be appointed for a term of 12 three years, except that of the members first appointed, three shall 13 serve for a term of three years, two shall serve for a term of two years 14 and one shall serve for a term of one year. Each member shall hold 15 office until his successor has been qualified and appointed. Any 16 vacancy in the membership of the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> shall be filled 17 for the unexpired term in the manner provided for in the original appointment. No member of the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> may serve 18 more than two successive terms in addition to any unexpired term to 19 20 which the member has been appointed.

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5. Members of the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> shall be reimbursed for
expenses and provided with office and meeting facilities and personnel
required for the proper conduct of the business of the <sup>1</sup>[committee]
<u>board</u><sup>1</sup>.

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6. The '[committee] board<sup>1</sup> shall organize within 30 days after 27 the appointment of its members and shall annually elect from its 28 29 members a chairperson and a vice-chairperson, and may appoint a 30 secretary, who need not be a member of the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>. The <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> shall meet at least twice a year and may 31 32 hold additional meetings as necessary to discharge its duties. A majority of the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> membership shall constitute a 33 34 quorum.

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36 7. The <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> shall have the following powers and
37 duties:

a. issue and renew licenses to <sup>1</sup>[drama therapists and
dance/movement] <u>creative arts</u><sup>1</sup> therapists pursuant to the provisions

b. suspend, revoke or fail to renew the license of a <sup>1</sup>[drama
therapist or dance/movement] <u>creative arts</u><sup>1</sup> therapist pursuant to the
provisions of P.L.1978, c.73 (C.45:1-14 et seq.);

place of business, place of residence, and the date and number of their 1 2 license; 3 d. prescribe or change the charges for examinations, licensures, 4 renewal and other services performed pursuant to P.L.1974, c.46 5 (C.45:1-3.1 et seq.); 6 e. establish standards for the continuing education of <sup>1</sup>[licensed 7 clinical drama therapists, licensed associate drama therapists, licensed dance/movement therapists, 8 clinical and licensed associate 9 dance/movement] creative arts<sup>1</sup> therapists; and f. promulgate rules and regulations <sup>1</sup>[to carry out matters 10 11 delegated to the committee by the board **]**<sup>1</sup> concerning any provisions of this act, in conformance with the "Administrative Procedure Act," 12 13 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.). 14 15 8. a. No person shall engage in the practice of drama therapy or dance/movement therapy unless licensed as a clinical drama 16 17 therapist, associate drama therapist, clinical dance/movement 18 therapist, or associate dance/movement therapist as the case may be, 19 pursuant to the provisions of this act. 20 b. No person shall use the title "Licensed Clinical Drama 21 Therapist" or "Licensed Associate Drama Therapist" or the 22 abbreviation "LCDT" or "LADT" or any other title, designation, 23 words, letters, abbreviations or insignia indicating the practice of 24 drama therapy unless licensed pursuant to the provisions of this act. shall use the title "Licensed Clinical 25 c. No person 26 Dance/Movement Therapist," or "Licensed Associate 27 Dance/Movement Therapist," or the abbreviation "LCDMT" or "LADMT" or any other title, designation, words, letters, 28 29 abbreviations or insignia indicating the practice of dance/movement 30 therapy unless licensed pursuant to the provisions of this act. 31 32 9. Nothing in this act shall be construed to apply to: 33 a. the activities and services of qualified members of other professions, including physicians, psychologists, psychoanalysts, 34 35 registered nurses, marriage and family therapists, social workers, professional or rehabilitation counselors or any other professional 36 37 licensed by the State, when acting within the scope of their profession 38 and doing work of a nature consistent with their training, provided 39 they do not hold themselves out to the public as possessing a license 40 issued pursuant to this act or represent themselves by any professional 41 title regulated by this act. 42 b. the activities of a drama therapy nature on the part of persons 43 participating in a drama therapy educational program as a student at an 44 accredited or State-approved college or university, or in a drama therapy training program approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] board<sup>1</sup>, 45 provided that these activities and services constitute a part of a 46

(1) In the case of an applicant holding a master's degree in dramatherapy, the applicant shall have completed:

26 (a) A minimum of 60 graduate credit hours or the equivalent, as approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, from an accredited educational 27 institution that is approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] board<sup>1</sup>, or if the 28 applicant has a master's degree in drama therapy from an accredited 29 30 educational institution but graduated with less than the required 60 31 graduate credit hours or the equivalent, as approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, the applicant shall also have additional graduate 32 credit hours in a closely related field, as approved by the 33 34 <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, to satisfy the required total of 60 graduate credit 35 hours or the equivalent; and

(b) At least two years full-time or its equivalent, but no less than
3,640 hours of supervised, paid clinical experience as a drama
therapist in a human service setting approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee]
<u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, at least a majority of hours having been acquired within the
past seven years and after the awarding of the master's degree.

The 3,640 hours required pursuant to this subparagraph shall include a minimum of 1,200 hours of supervised, paid clinical experience as a drama therapist in a human service setting approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> and a maximum of 2,440 hours of supervised private practice, consulting, or independent contract work in drama therapy approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, provided that the applicant is licensed in this State to practice in a clinical mental health

1 profession. Only supervised private practice, consulting, or 2 independent contract work accrued after the 1,200 hours of clinical 3 experience in an approved human service setting will be counted 4 towards the requirements for the license. At least a majority of these 5 hours must have been acquired within the past seven years and after 6 the awarding of the master's degree.

7 (2) In the case of an applicant holding a master's or doctoral 8 degree in a mental health discipline from an accredited educational 9 institution of higher learning with specific additional training in drama 10 therapy coursework, and completion of a drama therapy internship, the 11 applicant also shall have completed:

12 (a) A minimum of 60 graduate credit hours or the equivalent, as approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, in a mental health discipline; or 13 14 if the applicant has a master's degree in a mental health discipline 15 from an accredited educational institution but graduated with less than 16 the required 60 graduate credit hours or the equivalent, as approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, the applicant for licensure shall also have 17 18 additional graduate credit hours in a closely related field, as approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, to satisfy the required total of 60 19 20 graduate credit hours or the equivalent;

(b) A minimum of 27 graduate credit hours, or an equivalent
number of graduate credit hours, or equivalent instructional hours, in
drama therapy coursework supervised by a Drama Therapy Board
Certified Trainer and approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>;

(c) At least two years full-time, or its equivalent, but no less than
3,640 hours of supervised, paid clinical experience as a drama
therapist in a human service setting approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee]
<u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, at least a majority of hours having been acquired within the
past seven years and after the awarding of the master's degree.

30 The 3,640 hours required pursuant to this subparagraph shall 31 include a minimum of 1,200 hours of supervised, paid clinical 32 experience as a drama therapist in a human service setting approved by 33 the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> and a maximum of 2,440 hours of supervised private practice, consulting, or independent contract work in drama 34 therapy approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, provided that the 35 36 applicant is licensed in this State to practice in a clinical mental health 37 profession. Only supervised private practice, consulting, or 38 independent contract work hours that are accrued after the 1,200 hours 39 of clinical experience in an approved human service setting will be 40 counted towards the requirements for the license. At least a majority 41 of these hours shall have been acquired within the past seven years and 42 after the awarding of the master's degree;

(d) A minimum of one hour of supervision by a Drama Therapy
Board Certified Trainer, or by a Registered Drama Therapist with the
equivalent of a minimum of three years of full-time professional
experience for every 35 hours of private practice, consulting, or
independent contract work;

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(e) A minimum of 500 hours of concentrated theater/drama 1 2 This may include acting, directing, or training and study. 3 improvisational work studied or performed in a college, community or 4 professional setting. 5 The graduate course work in drama therapy from an accredited 6 college or university program that is approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] board<sup>1</sup> shall include training in: 7 8 (1) The drama therapy profession; 9 (2) Theory and practice of drama therapy; 10 (3) Human growth and developmental dynamics in drama; (4) Drama therapy with clinical populations; 11 12 (5) Drama therapy appraisal, diagnosis and assessment; 13 (6) Ethical and legal issues of drama therapy practice; 14 (7) Multicultural counseling and competency; 15 (8) Ethics, advanced theories and practice; 16 (9) Group dynamics; 17 (10) Abnormal psychology; 18 (11) Individual counseling; and 19 (12) Psychodrama or sociodrama; and d. Has passed an examination administered <sup>1</sup>[or approved by the 20 committee] by the board or administered by an approved third party<sup>1</sup>. 21 22 23 11. To be eligible to be licensed as a clinical dance/movement therapist, an applicant shall fulfill the following requirements: 24 25 a. Is at least 21 years of age; 26 b. Is of good moral character; 27 c. Holds a master's degree in dance/movement therapy from an 28 accredited educational institution of higher learning that is approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] board<sup>1</sup>; or a master's degree or a doctoral degree 29 30 in a mental health discipline from an accredited educational institution of higher learning with specific additional training in dance/movement 31 therapy coursework, fieldwork experience, and has completed a 32 dance/movement therapy internship as approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] 33 34 board<sup>1</sup>. 35 (1) In the case of an applicant holding a master's degree in 36 dance/movement therapy, the applicant shall have completed: (a) A minimum of 60 graduate credit hours or the equivalent, as 37 approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] board<sup>1</sup>, from an accredited educational 38 institution that is approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>; or if the 39 applicant has a master's degree in dance/movement therapy from an 40 41 accredited educational institution but graduated with less than the required 60 credit hours, the applicant for licensure shall also have 42 43 additional graduate credit hours in a closely related field, as approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup>, to satisfy the required total of 60 44 45 graduate credit hours or the equivalent; and 46 (b) At least two years full time or its equivalent, but no less than

5 The 3,640 hours required pursuant to this subparagraph shall include a minimum of 1,200 hours of supervised, paid clinical 6 7 experience as a dance/movement therapist in a human service setting approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] <u>board</u><sup>1</sup> and a maximum of 2,440 hours 8 of supervised private practice, consulting, or independent contract 9 work in dance/movement therapy approved by the <sup>1</sup>[committee] 10 board<sup>1</sup>, provided that the applicant is licensed in this State to practice 11 12 in a clinical mental health profession. Only supervised private practice, 13 consulting, or independent contract work hours that are accrued after 14 the 1,200 hours of clinical experience in an approved human service 15 setting will be counted towards the requirements for the license. At 16 least a majority of these hours shall have been acquired within the past 17 seven years and after the awarding of the master's degree;

degree in a mental health discipline from an accredited educational

dance/movement therapy coursework, fieldwork experience, and
