SYNOPSIS

Requires training or experience in crime victims' rights for certain members of Victims of Crime Compensation Review Board.

1 AN ACT concerning compensation for victims of crime and 2 amending P.L.2007, c.95. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.2007, c.95 (C.52:4B-3.2) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 2. a. There is hereby established in the Department of the 10 Treasury the Victims of Crime Compensation Agency. 11 b. The chief executive officer of the Victims of Crime 12 Compensation Agency shall be the executive director, who shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the 13 Senate. The executive director shall serve at the pleasure of the 14 15 Governor. The Governor may appoint an acting executive director to serve as chief executive officer of the Victims of Crime 16 17 Compensation Agency, who may be the person serving as chairman 18 of the Victims of Crime Compensation Board on the effective date 19 of P.L.2007, c.95 (C.52:4B-3.2 et al.), and who shall serve as the 20 executive director of the Victims of Crime Compensation Agency 21 until his successor is appointed and qualifies. The executive director 22 shall, in consultation with the Review Board established pursuant to 23 subsection c. of this section, develop, establish and supervise all 24 practices and procedures of the agency. 25 There is hereby established in the Victims of Crime c. 26 Compensation Agency the Victims of Crime Compensation Review 27 Board which shall be composed of five citizens, to be appointed by 28 the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, one of 29 whom shall be designated chairman by, and serve as such at the 30 pleasure of, the Governor. Four members of the board shall, by 31 training or experience, have expertise in the rights of crime victims. 32 At least one member of the board shall be an attorney admitted to 33 the practice of law in the State of New Jersey and who shall have 34 practiced law in the courts of New Jersey for a minimum of five 35 years. The purpose of the Victims of Crime Compensation Review Board shall be: 36 37 (1) to hear appeals of decisions of the Victims of Crime 38 Compensation Agency involving issues of victim compensation; 39 (2) to consult with the executive director in developing, 40 establishing and supervising all practices and procedures of the 41 agency; 42 (3) to review individual and supplemental awards to a victim or a victim's family in excess of \$10,000 in the aggregate, and awards 43 44 of attorney fees for legal representation to victims;

This act shall take effect immediately. 19 20 21 **STATEMENT** 22 23 This bill requires that certain members of the Victims of Crime 24 Compensation Review Board (VCCRB) have expertise in crime 25 victims' rights. 26 The purpose of the VCCRB is to: (1) hear appeals from decisions of the Victims of Crime 27 Compensation Agency involving issues of victim compensation; 28 29 (2) consult with the executive director regarding the practices 30 and procedures of the agency; (3) review certain individual and supplemental awards to a 31 victim or a victim's family and awards of attorney fees for legal 32 33 representation to victims; 34 (4) review information regarding agency operations and claims 35 received and paid by the agency; and 36 (5) review and, if appropriate, approve any rules and regulations 37 pertaining to reimbursement proposed by the agency. Under current law, the VCCRB members are not required to 38 39 have any background in or training pertaining to crime victims' 40 rights. Current law provides that the board is to be composed of 41 five citizens appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent 42 of the Senate. In addition, current law provides that at least one 43 member of the board is required to be an attorney licensed in this 44 State with five years of experience. Under this bill, four out of five 45 members of the VCCRB would be required to have expertise in 46 crime victims' rights.
