SYNOPSIS

"Paul's Law"; authorizes parent or guardian to request use of individualized health care plan for student with epilepsy or seizure disorder.

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AN ACT concerning the care of students with epilepsy and seizure
 disorders, designated as "Paul's Law," and supplementing
 chapter 40 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. As used in this act:

9 "Individualized emergency health care plan" means a document 10 developed by the school nurse, in consultation with the parent or 11 guardian of a student with epilepsy or a seizure disorder and other 12 appropriate medical professionals, which is consistent with the recommendations of the student's health care providers and which 13 outlines a set of procedural guidelines that provide specific 14 15 directions about what to do in a particular emergency situation and 16 is signed by the parent or guardian and the school nurse.

17 "Individualized health care plan" means a document developed 18 by the school nurse, in consultation with the parent or guardian of a student with epilepsy or a seizure disorder and other appropriate 19 20 medical professionals who may be providing epilepsy or seizure disorder care to the student, which is consistent with the 21 22 recommendations of the student's health care providers and which 23 sets out the health services needed by the student at school and is 24 signed by the parent or guardian and the school nurse.

25 "School" means an elementary or secondary public school26 located within this State.

27 "School employee" means a person employed by a school28 district.

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30 2. a. The parent or guardian of a student with epilepsy or a 31 seizure disorder who seeks epilepsy or seizure disorder care while 32 at school shall inform the school nurse who shall develop an 33 individualized health care plan and an individualized emergency 34 health care plan for the student, provided that the parents or 35 guardians of the student annually provide to the board of education written authorization for the provision of epilepsy or seizure 36 37 disorder care as may be outlined in the individualized plans.

b. The individualized health care plan and individualized
emergency health care plan developed in accordance with
subsection a. of this section shall be updated by the school nurse
prior to the beginning of each school year and as necessary in the
event that there is a change in the health status of the student.

c. Each individualized health care plan shall include, and each
individualized emergency health care plan may include, the
following information:

46 (1) written orders from the student's physician or advanced47 practice nurse outlining the epilepsy or seizure disorder care;

1 (2) the symptoms of the epilepsy or seizure disorder for that 2 particular student and recommended care; 3 (3) full participation in exercise and sports, and any 4 contraindications to exercise, or accommodations that must be made 5 for that particular student; 6 (4) accommodations for school trips, after-school activities, 7 class parties, and other school-related activities; 8 (5) education of all school personnel about epilepsy and seizure 9 disorders, how to recognize and provide care for epilepsy and 10 seizure disorders, and when to call for assistance; 11 (6) medical and treatment issues that may affect the educational 12 process of the student with epilepsy or the seizure disorder; 13 (7) the student's ability to manage, and the student's level of understanding of, the student's epilepsy or seizure disorder; and 14 15 (8) how to maintain communication with the student, the 16 student's parent or guardian and health care team, the school nurse, 17 and the educational staff. 18 (1) The school nurse assigned to a particular school shall d. coordinate the provision of epilepsy and seizure disorder care at that 19 20 school and ensure that all staff are trained every two years in the 21 care of students with epilepsy and seizure disorders, including staff 22 working with school-sponsored programs outside of the regular 23 school day, as provided in the individualized health care plan and 24 the individualized emergency health care plan. 25 (2) The training required pursuant to paragraph (1) of this 26 subsection shall include a Department of Education-approved on-27 line or in-person course of instruction provided by a nonprofit national organization that supports the welfare of individuals with 28 29 epilepsy and seizure disorders. 30 31 3. In the event that a school bus driver transports a student with 32 epilepsy or a seizure disorder, a school district shall provide the 33 driver with: a notice of the student's condition; information on how 34 to provide care for epilepsy or the seizure disorder; emergency contact information; epilepsy and seizure disorder first aid training; 35 36 and parent contact information. 37 38 4. The school nurse shall obtain a release from the parent or 39 guardian of a student with epilepsy or a seizure disorder to 40 authorize the sharing of medical information between the student's physician or advanced practice nurse and other health care 41 providers. The release shall also authorize the school nurse to share 42 medical information with other staff members of the school district 43 44 as necessary. 45 46 5. No school employee, including a school nurse, a school bus driver, a school bus aide, or any other officer or agent of a board of 47 48 education, shall be held liable for any good faith act or omission

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consistent with the provisions of this act, nor shall an action before
the New Jersey State Board of Nursing lie against a school nurse for
any such action taken by a person trained in good faith by the
school nurse pursuant to this act. Good faith shall not include
willful misconduct, gross negligence, or recklessness.

- 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
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STATEMENT

12 This bill concerns the care provided to public school students with epilepsy or seizure disorders and is designated as "Paul's 13 Law." Under the bill's provisions, the parents or guardians of a 14 student with epilepsy or a seizure disorder who seek epilepsy or 15 16 seizure disorder care for that student while at school will inform the 17 school nurse. The school nurse will develop an individualized 18 health care plan and an individualized emergency health care plan for that student provided that the parent or guardian provides annual 19 20 written authorization for the provision of epilepsy or seizure 21 disorder care at school.

Each individualized health care plan must include and each individualized emergency health care plan may include the following:

(1) written orders from the student's physician or advanced
practice nurse outlining the epilepsy or seizure disorder care;

(2) the symptoms of the epilepsy or seizure disorder for thatparticular student and recommended care;

(3) full participation in exercise and sports, and any
contraindications to exercise, or accommodations that must be made
for that particular student;

32 (4) accommodations for school trips, after-school activities,33 class parties, and other school-related activities;

34 (5) education of all school personnel about epilepsy and seizure
35 disorders, how to recognize and provide care for epilepsy and
36 seizure disorders, and when to call for assistance;

37 (6) medical and treatment issues that may affect the educational38 process of the student with epilepsy or a seizure disorder;

(7) the student's ability to manage, and the student's level ofunderstanding of, the student's epilepsy or seizure disorder; and

41 (8) how to maintain communication with the student, the
42 student's parent or guardian and health care team, the school nurse,
43 and the educational staff.

Under the provisions of the bill, the school nurse assigned to a particular school will coordinate the provision of epilepsy and seizure disorder care at that school and ensure that all staff are trained every two years in the care of students with epilepsy and seizure disorders. The training is required to include a Department

1 of Education-approved on-line or in-person course of instruction provided by a nonprofit national organization that supports the 2 3 welfare of individuals with epilepsy and seizure disorders.

4 The bill provides that a school district must provide to a school 5 bus driver who transports a pupil with epilepsy or a seizure disorder: a notice of the pupil's condition; information on how to 6 7 provide care in the case of epilepsy or a seizure disorder; 8 emergency contact information; epilepsy and seizure disorder first 9 aid training; and parent contact information.

10 Finally, the bill provides that a school employee will not be liable for any good faith action taken in accordance with the bill's 11
